In one of his last official acts as sheriff, Jewell presented Valor Awards to five sheriff's officers for acts of courage in life-threatening situations. Two of the men were wounded in the line of duty:

The awards were presented Tuesday for bravery in incidents dating back to 1970. Jewell said he was "a little embarrassed" to be presenting them now, three days before his retirement, but said the timing doesn't take away from what the officers did.
